* The show may not run when non-harvesting of the firefly squids occurs due to weather conditions.

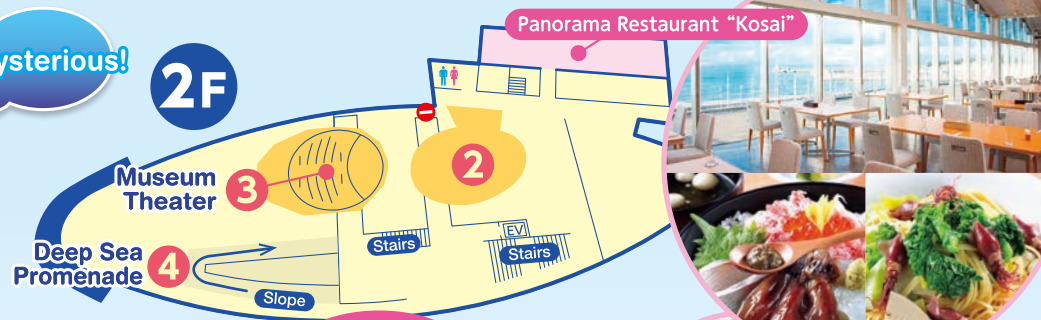

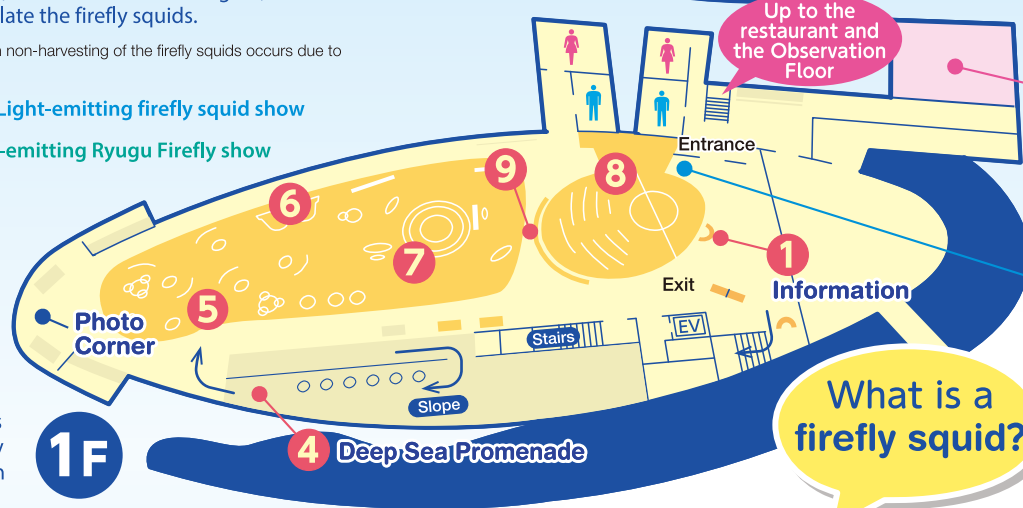

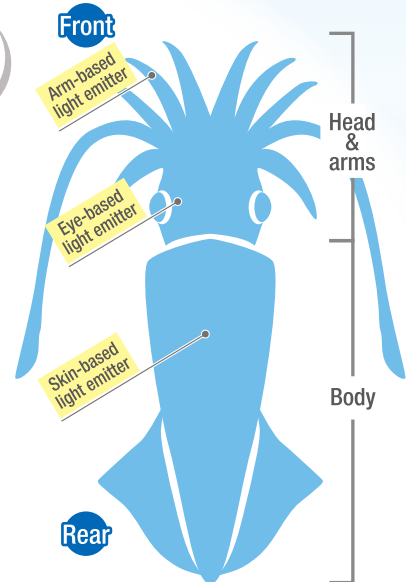
Sensational deep-sea creatures, including giant isopod!!

In spring, firefly squids flock and emit a beautiful blue light in Toyama Bay while laying their eggs. The area where they surface and create this phenomenon has been designated a special natural monument.

The secret of emitting light

Firefly squids emit light for three reasons: to ward off predators, to hide from predators by camouflaging themselves, and to communicate with other firefly squids.

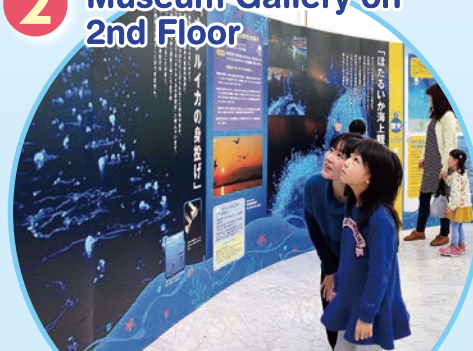
